Having a dog helps a child learn how to act responsibly. As a dog owner, the child must take care of the animal's daily needs. The dog must be fed and exercised every day. A dog is completely dependent on its owner for all its needs, including the needs for good health and safe environment. Therefore, the owner is responsible for the welfare of its dog. Being responsible for a dog also means taking care of the dog so the dog stays healthy and well trained. Furthermore, the owner must take the responsibility for the safety of the dog and the safety of the people it comes into contact with. If the child forgets any of these duties and responsibilities, or ignores any of the dog's needs, the dog will suffer.
